Efficacy of Homeopathic Medicines in Treatment of Alcohol Addiction

Abstract: The per capita alcohol consumption in India increased two folds between 2005 and 2016, according to the Global Status Report on Alcohol and Health 2018 released by the WHO. Indians consumed 2.4 l of alcohol in 2005, which increased to 4.3l in 2010 and up to 5.7 l in 2016, the report suggested. More than 3 Million people died as a result of harmful use of alcohol in 2016. Far too many people, their families and communities suffer the consequences of the harmful use of alcohol through violence, injuries, mental health problems and disease such as cancer and stroke¹. The aim of my study is to prove the efficacy of Homeopathic medicines in the treatment of alcohol addiction and to prevent its harmful effects. The study was conducted for 18 months. This research is mostly focused on alcohol addiction. As this was an exploratory study, it included an exploration of different aspects of alcoholism. Considering all the parameters out of 50 cases 34% are now in low risk group, 48% medium risk and 8% high risk group. Where as 10% cases show no improvement and are still in addicted category. So, from above study it is concluded that 90% of the cases responded well to the indicated Homoeopathic remedy.

Alcohol addiction is inability to control drinking due to both physical & emotional dependence on alcohol, also called alcoholism. Factors like genetics, sex, and race of socioeconomics that may predispose someone to alcohol addiction. Psychological, genetic & behavioral factors can all contributes to having the disease.

- Having no control over the alcohol consumption.
- · Constant urge for drinking.
- Have more tolerance without hangover.
- Use to behave differently after drinking.
- Lacking to face the family situations.

If alcohol consumption continuous for a long time leading to severe health problems like nervous weakness, liver disease, heart disease, diabetes, etc². Homeopathy is capable of treating persons mentally as well as physical aspects (Holistic approach). It treats such cases from the origin of addiction upto the withdrawal effects.

Homoeopathic approach involves the counseling, adequate measures for de - addiction & appropriate medications. With constitutional treatment I have also used mother tinctures like Quercus Glandium Spiritus, Passiflora Indica, Avina Sativa. Apart from homoeopathic remedies there is a need for supportive measures to detoxify the effect of alcohol and that body needs a healthy diet to make up deficiencies. Along with this few life style changes will also help in quitting alcohol habits³.

For the conduction of this study my choice of Repertory is Synthesis Repertory as it has extensive and well elaborated MIND section therefore fulfilling my requirement of case studies

2. Materials & Methodology

The study has been conducted on the patients who attended OPD, IPD, and peripheral dispensaries of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Homoeopathic Medical College & Hospital, Ludhiana.

Inclusion Criteria:

All the cases involves patients addicted with alcohol only. Drinking more than 14 drinks/ week for women and 21 drinks/ week for men in the age group of 18 - 60 years.

Exclusion Criteria

Associated symptoms like bad effect of alcohol over the other organs of the body are excluded in the study. Pregnant women, subjects with addiction other then alcohol. Subjects who are dependent over the steroidal therapies & immunosuppressant or other allopathic treatment.

Research Technique

Individualization of each patient after proper case taking is done and medicine is be selected on the basis of symptom similarity. Repertorization from Synthesis Repertory has been done to find the similimum. The data from the sample size of 50 was statistically analyzed, yielding a 95% confidence limit. T - tests were

used to demonstrate the efficacy in the post - test results.

3. Result

- This study achieves practically all of the aims and objectives that were established for it.
- Most of the cases were in the age group of 41 50 years which is 34%, followed by the age groups of 31 40 years, 51 60 years & the least in 18 30 years which was 32%, 30% & 4% respectively. All the cases were male patients. There was no female patient for the treatment.




Figure 1: Graphical representation of cases on the basis of Age Group

Categorizing the cases on the basis of socio - economic status 54% cases belonged to middle class.32% lower economic group 14% high socio economic group.




Figure 2: Graphical representation of cases on the basis of Socio Economic Status

Out of 50 cases 34% cases showed marked improvement and their alcohol screen score came down to 0 - 7 (Low Risk).48% cases showed moderate improvement with alcohol screen score from 8 - 15 (Medium risk category).8% High risk with 16 - 19 screen score. While 10% case showed no improvement with alcohol screen score above 20 likely addicted.




Figure 3: Graphical representation of cases on the basis of Alcohol screen score post treatment

As per the statistical analyses of sample size of 50 cases it is observed that the two major predisposing factors of alcohol addiction in patients is bad company and family dispute which is about 24% and 22%. Which is then followed by

depression and work load at 14% both, business and financial loss, grief and society status at 10%, 8% and 8% respectively.




Figure 4: Graphical representation of cases on the basis of Predisposing factor

Puls, and China. With Material doses of Avena Sativa Q, Quercus - G, and Passiflora.




Figure 5: Graphical representation of cases on the basis of Medicine Prescribed

4. Discussion

In the process of the study, proper case taking has been done followed by analysis and evaluation of the symptoms, repertorisation was done from Synthesis Repertory, in which the eliminating symptoms which represent the patient as a whole were used. During the study cases that involved alcohol addiction were studied. The statistical analysis of the study shows that most affected age group is 31 - 40 and 41 -50 years that is the most important phase of life both financially and emotionally. With their predisposing factor being family disputes and bad company patients in these age group often tend to alcoholism to calm themselves. Although the study was initially meant to be conducted on both sex but it was seen that there was no female patient up for the treatment in the OPD for various reasons and that opens up a window for new further researches. Because of the stressful environment and societal pressure, the middle income group is more affected (54%) than the upper income group (14%) and lower income group (32%). From the study of homeopathic medicines in the treatment of alcohol addiction the results are very positive. It is now proven that homeopathic remedies can cure most of cases of alcoholism and that was the main reason behind conducting this research

5. Conclusion

The study sample comprises of total 50 patients which were selected on the basis of inclusion and exclusion criteria from IPD/OPD and Peripheral dispensaries of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Homoeopathic Medical College & hospital, Ludhiana and following conclusion has been procured after analysis and observation of the outcomes of the study with proper statistical analysis using paired t - test.
